OUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF BEFORE POSTING

Social media can be a great tool you can use to communicate the Gospel to those with whom you might not otherwise have access. Not only are we communicating with the commenters, but also the silent observers. Many people will scroll through the conversations and be influenced by what they read. With this in mind, we always try to comment with a purpose. These questions help us process our conversation goals:

- > What do I hope this will accomplish?
- > Will this build a relationship with this person?
- > Is this a faithful witness to our Savior?

RESPONDING TO COMMON COMMENTS

We often get the same types of comments over and over again. Many do not understand why we are witnessing to Mormons.

"Why are you targeting LDS?"

It is tempting to dance around the bush, but we often find that it saves time to be direct. Emphasize that the stakes are high. This is a matter of eternal life and death.

"We believe the same as you."

Because LDS call themselves Christian and believe that they are saved by Christ, they are often surprised that we do not think we believe the same. LDS believe that Jesus saved us from physical death so that we might progress to live eternally with God.



This is a great place to begin a productive conversation about all Christ has done for you. For example, you could ask, "Do you believe that God sees you as perfect right now?" and then describe how you are already perfected by the atonement of Christ. You are certain that you will spend eternity with God on the day you die because you are covered with Christ's perfection.

"You are wrong/speaking falsely, etc."

Often LDS commenters will throw this out as a general statement. Often, they feel as if they are being persecuted. Usually, it is helpful to ask the commenter to be more specific about their disagreement. Then, if appropriate, reassure them that we love them and are not persecuting them. Hopefully, a conversation door will be opened to share the gospel.

ESTABLISHING RELATIONSHIPS

Sometimes, we can deepen the relationship with the commenter by transitioning to Messenger. Often, the tone and direction of the conversation changes, providing the opportunity to engage in deeper and more honest dialogue. Try private messaging some with the thought that it is easier to keep track of important conversations in Messenger. Some won't accept this but some will.

BEST PRACTICES TO RESIST

Majoring in Minors: Many people will quickly go on unimportant tangents. Try to bring the conversation back to significant themes. Answer their questions or respond to their statements briefly, and then redirect the conversation to more important topics.

Debating LDS doctrine with LDS Members: It is much easier and often more effective to proclaim the gospel and what you know to be true rather than try to discuss Mormon beliefs. Instead, focus on the joy and confidence you have in Christ.

Responding Negatively: It is tempting to react negatively to hostile comments and false teachings. However, this is an excellent opportunity to show unexpected patience, kindness, and love. Sometimes, we can diffuse the emotions of the commenter and have a productive conversation. Often, others are silently observing and may be impacted by grace-filled conversations. It is always good to encourage both Christians and LDS alike to emphasize respect and never ridicule.


Dictionary of Mormonese
